- Annual Meeting was held at 705 Harrison Street Dec 2/22; approx. 75 residents attended, including some new families
- Billy Specht (Chairman) invited the new owner of Royal Oak Golf Course to the annual meeting but he was unable to attend
- Some residents felt there should be a new group started (to oppose development); Billy encouraged residents to join ROCA as the voice for the Royal Oak Community
- Several residents voiced concerns about traffic, entrances, etc. if the development were to go through
- Good balance overall of opinions regarding the future of golf course
- Billy assured residents that ROCA will communicate frequently as possible when City meetings will be held



Electronic Speed Signs
